Religious disciplines so far.

- Vrata religious vow or discipline to build inner strength
- Pūja religious worship to establish personal relationship with Īśvara
- Upavāsa religious vow involving fasting along with prayer and contemplation
- Japa chanting the Lord's name as an oral form of worship that helps us become more aware of our thoughts and thought patterns and evokes devotion for the Lord:
 - Uccha-japa (loud chanting); Manda-japa (soft chanting);
 Citta-japa (purely mental) also called dhyāna

Gita and the Japa

- Lord Kṛṣṇa says (Gita 10.25): "Yagnānām japa yagnosmi..." or "I am the japa amongst all the yagnas..."
- Japa is considered here by Lord Kṛṣṇa to be the best form of yagna!

महर्षीणां भृगुरहं गिरामस्म्येकमक्षरम् । यज्ञानां जपयज्ञोऽस्मि स्थावराणां हिमालयः ॥ १०-२५॥

MAUNA (SILENCE AS A RELIGIOUS DISCIPLINE)

- What is mauna?
 - Mauna is a religious discipline where one refrains from speaking (or watching TV, listening to music, etc.)
- What is NOT mauna?
 - Giving our parents (or family or friends) the famous "silent treatment"
 - Receiving the "silent treatment" from someone

- When you are angry with your (mother, father, sibling, friend) you keep silent. Why is this NOT *mauna*?
- When you play a prank on someone and are being questioned by the "authorities" (i.e., mother, father, teacher, etc.), you keep silent. Why is this NOT *mauna*?
- You keep silent when a teacher asks a question. Is that *mauna*? Why or why not?

- Mauna is actually a vrata or vow!
- Mauna-vrata is practiced with the intention of gaining mastery over our thought and speech
- Mauna-vrata is practiced with the intention of gaining spending time in prayer and contemplation
- One who practices *Mauna* is called a *muni*

- Is *mauna* valued in other religious and cultural traditions? What are some examples?
- In the Vedic culture, we do not speak while eating. Why?
- If you were to have none of the below how would YOU spend your day?
 - TV, phone, talking, computer, devices that produce music/sound, or other external forms of entertainment

- Mahatma Gandhi regularly practiced Mauna every week
- Ramana Maharsi lived a life of *muni*
- Lord Daksinamurthi is said to have imparted Self-Knowledge to the *Sanatkumaras* (thought-children of Lord Brahma) through *mauna-vyakhya* (exposition through silence)
- Let us chant the *Daksinamurthy stotram*

Lord Daksinamurthi

From Swami Tadatamananda Saraswati's Atma Bodha Ashram, New Jersey



- Contains the most profound teachings of Advaita Vedanta
- Set in a meter called "Shardula Vikridita"
- Superb piece of poetry
- The wisdom in the Daksinamurthy stotram is capable of destroying *mula-avidya* or "root-ignorance" (fundamental ignorance)
- The Dakṣinamurthy stotram is *mokṣa-sastra* knowledge that can lead one to liberation

Mauna vyākhyā prakatita parabrahma tatvam yuvānam Varṣiṣthānte vasadṛṣigaṇairāvrtam brahmaniṣṭaiḥ Ācāryendram karakalita cinmudramānanda rupam Svātmārāmam muditavadanam dakṣinamūrtimīde

A young guru, imparting knowledge of Brahman through silence, surrounded by *rishis* who are firmly established in wisdom...

...teacher of teachers, whose gesture signifies wisdom, whose nature is fullness, smiling, reveling in himself, I worship that Lord Dakshinamurti

वटविटपिसमीपेभूमिभागे निषण्णं सकलमुनिजनानां ज्ञानदातारमारात् । त्रिभुवनगुरुमीशं दक्षिणामूर्तिदेवं जननमरणदुःखच्छेद दक्षं नमामि ॥२॥

Vatavitapisamipe bhūmibhāge niṣaṇṇaṁ Sakalamunijanām jnānadātaramārāt Tribhuvanagurmīśam dakṣinamūrtidevaṁ Jananamaṛaṇa duḥkhacchedadakṣam namāmi

Seated on the ground under the banyan tree, bestowing knowledge to all the *rishis* who have assembled near him...

... teacher of the three worlds, destroyer of the miseries of birth and death, I bow to that Lord.

चित्रं वटतरोर्मूले वृद्धाः शिष्या गुरुर्युवा । गुरोस्तु मौनं व्याख्यानं शिष्यास्तुच्छिन्नसंशयाः ॥३॥

Chitram vatatarormūle vṛddhāḥ śiṣyā gururyuvā Gurostu maunam vyākhyānam śiṣyā stu cchinasamśayāḥ

Amazing! Under the banyan tree aged disciples sat around a youthful guru. He taught them in silence, yet their doubts were dispelled...

निधये सर्वविद्यानां भिषजे भवरोगिणाम् । गुरवे सर्वलोकानां दक्षिणामूर्तये नमः ॥४॥

Nidhaye sarvavidyānām bhiṣaje bhavarogiṇām Gurave sarva lokānām dakṣiṇāmūrtaye namaḥ

Salutations to Lord Dakshinamurti, the abode of all wisdom, teacher of the whole world, healing those who suffer from the disease of samsara...

ॐ नमः प्रणवार्थाय शुद्धज्ञानैकमूर्तये । निर्मलाय प्रशान्ताय दक्षिणामूर्तये नमः ॥५॥

Om namaḥ praṇavārthāya suddhajnānaika mūrtaye Nirmālaya praśāntāya dakṣiṇāmūrtaye namaḥ

Salutations to Lord Dakshinamurti, who is the meaning of "Om", whose form is pure knowledge, who is taintless and utterly silent ...

ईश्वरो गुरुरात्मेति मूर्तिभेदविभागिने । व्योमवद् व्याप्तदेहाय दक्षिणामूर्तये नमः ॥७॥

Iśvaro gururātmeti mūrtibhedavibhāgine Vyomavad vyāptadehāya dakṣiṇāmūrtaye namaḥ

Salutations to Lord Dakshinamurti, who underlies all apparent forms of separation and pervades the universe...

विश्वं दर्पणदृश्यमाननगरीतुल्यं निजान्तर्गतं पश्यन्नात्मनि मायया बहिरिवोद्भूतं यथा निद्रया । यः साक्षात्कुरुते प्रबोधसमये स्वात्मानमेवाद्वयं तस्मै श्रीगुरुमूर्तये नम इदं श्रीदक्षिणामूर्तये ॥१॥

Viśvam darpaṇa dṛśyamānanagarī tulyam nijāntargatam Pasyanātmani māyayā bahurivodbhūtam yathā nidrayā Yaḥ sakśāt kurute prabodhasamaye svātmanamevādvaiyam Tasmai śri gurumūrtaye nama idam śri dakṣiṇāmūrtaye

To Him who sees the universe like a dream existing within oneself or like a city seen in a mirror but appearing externally due to maya...

...who upon enlightenment, beholds the universe directly as his own non-dual self – Salutations unto him, Shri Dakshinamurti in the form of my own guru ...

बीजस्याऽन्तरिवाङ्कुरो जगदिदं प्राङ्गनिर्विकल्पं पुनः मायाकल्पितदेशकालकलना वैचित्र्यचित्रीकृतम् । मायावीव विजृम्भयत्यपि महायोगीव यः स्वेच्छया तस्मै श्रीगुरुमूर्तये नम इदं श्रीदक्षिणामूर्तये ॥२॥

This universe, undifferentiated at first like a sprout within the seed, becoming manifold through maya's aspects of time and space...

...that universe he projects by his own desire like a magician or a great yogi – Salutations unto him, Shri Dakshinamurti in the form of my own teacher.

Whose reality appears as the unreal creation, who imparts immediate knowledge through the Vedic saying, "That thou art" to those who seek his refuge... ... because of whose direct knowledge one never returns to the ocean of birth and death – Salutations unto him, Shri Dakshinamurti in the form of my own teacher.

नानाच्छिद्रघटोदरस्थितमहादीपप्रभा भास्वरं ज्ञानं यस्य तु चक्षुरादिकरणद्वारा वहिः स्पन्दते । ज्ञानामीति तमेव भान्तमनुभात्येतत्समस्तं जगत् तस्मै श्रीगुरुमूर्तये नम इदं श्रीदक्षिणामूर्तये ॥४॥

Nanācchidraghatodarasthitamahā dīpaprabhā bhāsvaram Jnānam yasya tu cakṣurādikanadvāra bahiḥ spandate Jānāmīti tameva bhāntamanubhāt yetatsamastam jagat Tasmai śri gurumūrtaye nama idam śri dakṣiṇāmūrtaye

Whose knowledge is like the light of a shining lamp placed inside a pot with many holes, shining forth through the sense organs like sight ...

...who shines as consciousness, as "I know" because of which this entire creation appears

- Salutations unto him, Shri Dakshinamurti in the form of my own teacher.

देहं प्राणमपीन्द्रियाण्यपि चलां बुद्धिं च शून्यं विदुः स्त्रीबालान्धजडोपमास्त्वहमिति भ्रान्ता भृशं वादिनः । मायाशक्तिविलासकल्पितमहाव्यामोहसंहारिणे तस्मै श्रीगुरुमूर्तये नम इदं श्रीदक्षिणामूर्तये ॥५॥

Deham prāṇamapīndriyāṇyapi calam buddhim ca sunyam viduh Stribālāndha jadopamāstavahamiti bhrānta bhṛśam vādinaḥ Māyāśakti vilāsakalpitamahā vyāmoha samhāriṇe Tasmai śri gurumūrtaye nama idam śri dakṣiṇāmūrtaye

Philosophers who are misguided, childish, blind, or dull, always teach falsely that the body, life, senses, active intellect, and nonexistence is the self...
...who destroys their great delusion born of maya's power – Salutations unto him, Shri Dakshinamurti in the form of my own teacher.

राहुग्रस्तिदवाकरेन्दुसदृशो मायासमाच्छादनात् सन्मात्रः करणोपसहरणतो योऽभूत्सुषुप्तः पुमान् । प्रागस्वाप्समिति प्रबोधसमये यः प्रत्यभिज्ञायते तस्मै श्रीगुरुमूर्तये नम इदं श्रीदक्षिणामूर्तये ॥६॥

Rahugrasta divākarendu sadṛśo māyāsamacchādanāt Sanmātraḥ karaṇopasamharaṇato yo'bhūtsusuptaḥ pumān Prāgasvāp samite prabodhasamaye yaḥ pratyabhijnāyate Tasmai śri gurumūrtaye nama idam śri dakṣiṇāmūrtaye

Who remains as pure existence in the deep sleep caused by maya's power, withdrawing the senses like the sun or moon covered during an eclipsewho upon waking remembers "I slept" – Salutations unto him, Shri Dakshinamurti in the form of my own teacher.

बाल्यादिष्वपि जाग्रदादिषु तथा सर्वास्ववस्थास्वपि व्यावृतास्वनुवर्तमानमहमित्यन्तः स्फुरन्तं सदा । स्वात्मानं प्रकटीकरोति भजतां यो मुद्रयाभद्रया तस्मै श्रीगुरुमूर्तये नम इदं श्रीदक्षिणामूर्तये ॥७॥

Balyādviṣvapi jāgradadiṣu tathā sarvāsvavasthāsvapi Vyāvṛttāsvanuvartamāna mahityantah sphurantaṁ sadā Svātmānaṁ prakati karoti bhajatāṁ yo mudrayā bhadrayā Tasmai śri gurumūrtaye nama idaṁ śri dakṣiṇāmūrtaye

The self manifest within as the ever present sense of "I" ever-that remains in every state of life and experience...

...who reveals this self to his devotees by his auspicious gesture of wisdom – Salutations unto him, Shri Dakshinamurti in the form of my own teacher.

विश्वं पश्यित कार्यकारणतया स्वस्वामिसम्बन्धतः शिष्याचार्यतया तथैव पितृपुत्राद्यात्मना भेदतः । स्वप्ने जाग्रित वा य एष पुरुषो मायापरिभ्रामितः तस्मै श्रीगुरुमूर्तये नम इदं श्रीदक्षिणामूर्तये ॥८॥

Viśvam paśyati kārya kāraṇa tayā svasvāmisambhandhataḥ Śiṣyācharyatayā thathaivapitṛputrādyātmanā bhedataḥ Svapne jāgrati va ya eśa puruśo māyā paribhrāmitaḥ Tasmai śri gurumūrtaye nama idam śri dakṣiṇāmūrtaye

Who sees the universe as cause and effect, master and servant, teacher and disciple, father and son, and so on ...

...who sees all this in the waking and dream states due to maya – Salutations unto him, Shri Dakshinamurti in the form of my own teacher.

भूरमभांस्यनलोऽनिलोऽम्बरमहर्नाथो हिमांशु पुमान् इत्याभाति चराचरात्मकमिदं यस्यैव मूर्त्यष्टकम् नान्यत् किञ्चन विद्यते विमृशतां यस्मात्परस्माद्विभोः तस्मै श्रीगुरुमूर्तये नम इदं श्रीदक्षिणामूर्तये ॥९॥

Whose eight-fold manifestation is this sentient and insentient world of earth, water, fire, air, space, sun, moon, and conscious being...
...beyond whose all-pervasive nature there exists nothing else for wise persons – Salutations unto him, Shri Dakshinamurti in the form of my own teacher.

सर्वात्मत्वमिति स्फुटीकृतमिदं यस्मादमुष्मिन् स्तवे तेनास्य श्रवणात्तदर्थमननाद्ध्यानाच्च संकीर्तनात् । सर्वात्मत्वमहाविभूतिसहितं स्यादीश्वरत्वं स्वतः सिद्ध्येत्तत्पुनरष्टधा परिणतं चैश्वर्यमव्याहतम् ॥१०॥

Because the self's all-pervasiveness is clearly revealed in this hymn, by listening to it, reflecting upon it, meditating on its meaning, and reciting it... ... one can gain enlightenment, effortlessly and without impediments, with its great glory of being the self of all with eightfold blessings.

Om pūrņamadah pūrņamidam pūrņātpurņamudacyate pūrņasya pūrņamādāya pūrņamevāvaśiṣyate ||
 Om śāntiḥ śāntiḥ j ||

That is fullness, this is fullness. From that fullness this fullness came. From that fullness (when) this fullness (is) removed, what remains is fullness. Om peace, peace, peace
